They are guided by the head boy and the head girl of the RCL together with 6 Executive Members. They embody the *#trueblue* spirit of the school.

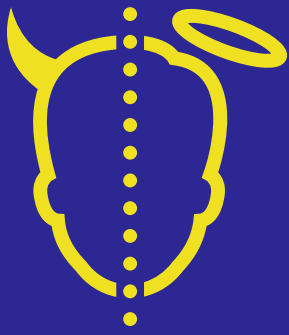

# Code of Conduct

While it is a learner's right to receive an education, and while Bryanston High School will strive to provide the educational opportunities our community has come to expect, it is important that learners acknowledge their responsibilities to themselves, their peers, their teachers and our school.

Learners will therefore commit themselves to:

- **Be punctual for school, every lesson and extra-mural activities;**
- **Establish realistic, clear and meaningful academic goals for each year's study programme;**
- **Establish a sound work ethic to ensure sustained academic progress;**
- **Assist in keeping our buildings and grounds neat and clean by not littering and by picking-up any litter they may find;**
- **Conduct themselves, whether on school premises or not, in a manner that is a credit to the image of our school;**
- **Be courteous and respectful in their conduct towards all staff, teachers, learners, councillors and visitors to our school.**
- **At all times adhere to the school rules as set out in the learners' diary.**
- **Involve themselves in all spheres of school life to ensure our high standards are maintained;**
- **Ensure that all equipment provided by the school is used with care;**
- **Wear their school uniform with pride and dignity at all times, whether at the school, on school outings or out in the community.**

The official school diary, which is issued at the beginning of the Grade 8 school year to every learner, contains Codes of Conduct for learners and parents, the Discipline Policy, General Rules and Uniform regulations.

**PARENTS ARE REQUIRED TO SIGN THE CODE OF CONDUCT.**

**Parents must also sign the diary daily and be aware of its contents.**

## **ARRIVING LATE / OR LEAVING EARLY PROCEDURE**

The school bell rings at 07h30. Any learner arriving after that time must report to the home zone area where the latecomers committee will record their names. Parents of all learners that are absent or late will get an automated SMS reporting the learner absent. The absentee list will be updated daily according to the latecomers list.

**Learners must obtain permission in their diary from all teachers of classes being missed before going to their Grade Controller to go home early. Under no circumstances can they phone their parents to collect them without telling their Grade Controller. They must report to the front office where they will be signed out and given a note for the guard at the gate to let them out. It is easier and preferable for parents to send a letter/email to the Grade Controllers in advance.**

The School prides itself on having amicable relations it enjoys with parents/guardians. While parents/guardians can be reassured that the school will provide their children with the best possible education with the resources available to it, parents/guardians must also acknowledge certain responsibilities when it comes to a child/ward's schooling. The parents/guardians must impress on their child/ward the importance of adhering to the school rules and the disciplinary standards required by the school and the parent body as a whole (as represented by the Governing Body).

# Code for Parents



## Parents shall strive to

1. Support educators in their efforts to teach their children i.e. monitor homework, check test results, help set goals, regularly consult the diary for educators' comments.
2. Communicate with Grade Controllers or the Principal timeously regarding areas of concern before they become major issues.
3. Involve themselves as much as possible in the School's activities, either actively on a Parents' Committee or Governing Body or simply as committed supporters of the School.
4. Familiarise themselves with the School's admission documents and the Code of Conduct to avoid confusion at a later date.
5. Make suggestions for learners through the Grade Controllers, or provide assistance on request to improve the educational process and environment.
6. Nurture their child's learning through guidance, questioning, assisting and showing interest in their child's academic progress.
7. Provide the daily opportunities needed by their child to complete set scholastic work at home.
8. Ensure that their child arrives punctually for all school activities.
9. Familiarise themselves with the School's Discipline Policy and support the School in the implementation and administration thereof.
10. Fulfil their financial obligation to the School by paying the school fees as agreed upon at the Annual General Meeting of the Parent Body.
11. Inculcate sound values and norms in their child to ensure that every child at Bryanston High School contributes to the establishment and maintenance of a stable learning environment.

*The school rules referred to in the above policy as well as the full school Code of Conduct is printed in the learner's diary.*

To help prevent cyber bullying and assist with the possible issues that may arise throughout the year, we as Grade Controllers would like to raise the following points with parents and guardians:

**1. Learners blocking parents on different platforms:**

a. Social media platforms, such as WhatsApp, Instagram, Facebook, TikTok and others, have the functionality on which you can block certain followers/friends from viewing specific posts and status updates. This allows learners to block their parents/guardians from viewing things they post daily. Learners have been making use of this functionality to publicly bully other learners and/or to post inappropriate photos of themselves and/or friends.

**2. Learners creating multiple accounts:**

a. The beforementioned social media platforms also allow users to create multiple profiles by some learners, which are used in a similar fashion. Learners create these additional profiles to contact other users/learners anonymously and bully/blackmail them.

**3. WhatsApp Groups:**

a. WhatsApp groups between learners are not permitted unless a teacher is present to monitor the content of the group. The school discourages the use of WhatsApp to contact other learners without the knowledge of parents/guardians.

**4. WhatsApp and its use by the school and teachers:**

a. WhatsApp is not considered as a formal means of communication by the school. Register class groups and subject groups are created by teachers purely as a method to remind learners of what homework has been given and is due, what the demarcation is for tests and for grade controllers to quickly find learners who are needed for whatever reason.

**5. School diaries:**

a. All learners are provided with a school diary at the start of each year. These diaries must be the primary resource used to record homework and must be used by learners when signing out for early collection.

**6. Parents overseeing phones:**

a. A reminder to parents struggling to limit their child's/ward's cellphone usage: You as the parent/guardian of the learner has full rights to take the phone away as it is YOUR property, not that of the learner. You are the one who purchased the phone, and you are the one allowing the learner to temporarily use it.

b. There is an application called "BARK" which parents/guardians can use to better control and limit their child/ward's use of their phones. This application allows parents to monitor incoming messages and set time limits on the use of phones. Please visit your phone's Appstore for more information on the app.

**7. Lost and stolen phones:**

a. Learners who bring their cellphones to school are responsible for keeping the phones safe. The school is in no way liable for the loss, damage, or theft of ANY cellular devices.

It is only with the support of parents/guardians that cyberbullying can be prevented. We as Grade Controllers implore you to be vigilant and monitor your child/ward and their online activities.

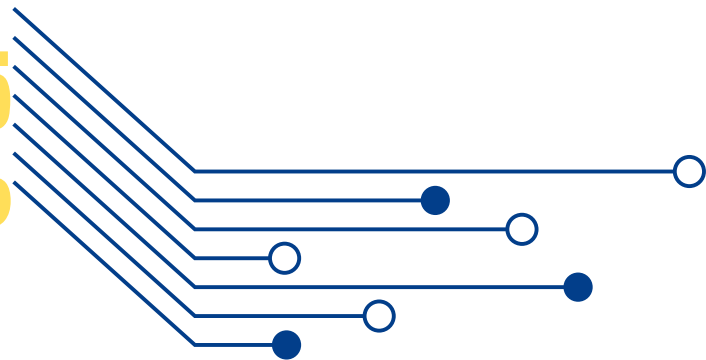

The counselling office is situated inside the Media Centre, straight down the steps, next to the zebra picture on the wall.

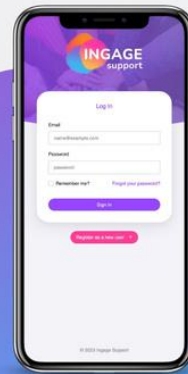

Dear Parents / Guardians

Blue Flame Café Tuckshop at Bryanston High School – Independently Run

Each child is on the Scadsys system which is a computerised point of sale at the tuckshop. Learners are able to load money on the system by either cash or credit or debit cards. The learner can load money onto their student number, this is a safe way of not having to carry cash with them at school. This system will not allow them to purchase on the student number if there is no money on their account.

Parents can log onto the parent portal via the Bryanston High School web site ([www.bryanston.com](http://www.bryanston.com)). Parents / learners need to register to access the portal. To check our full range of items and prices available to purchase you need to go to the parent drop down and scroll down to menu and restrictions. To see the student available balance, click on the Parent drop down menu – Student Account.

**The tuckshop has a pre-ordering system, whereby we urge the students to order their lunch etc. before school commences (we do not do online orders).** The tuckshop opens at 7am every morning for Pre-ordering. This method alleviates long queues and them not being able to purchase their preferred lunch and being disappointed due to being sold out of certain food. We have a separate queue for students who have pre-ordered which allows the students to seamlessly get their pre-order. From time-to-time specials will be run and advertised in advance.

We urge as many learners as possible to use the pre-order system to help us with social distancing.

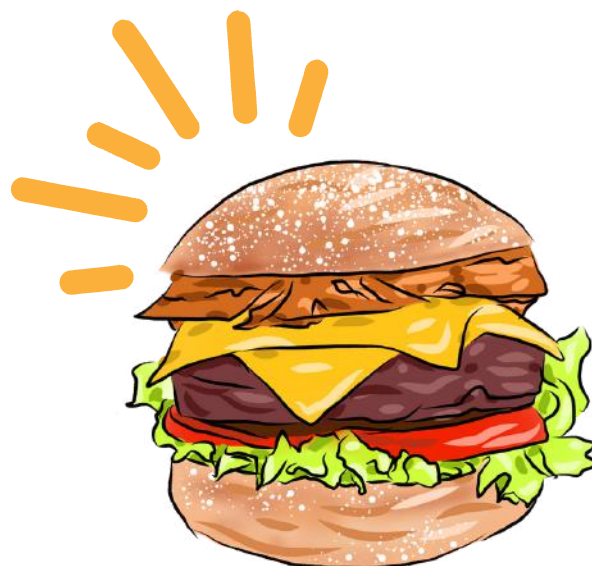

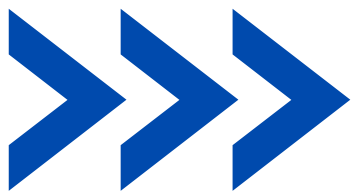

**1**

**WE'RE A FEE-PAYING SCHOOL** – If you're looking for a no-fee school, kindly ask any of our admissions staff for a list of nearby schools that are State supported and do not charge fees. Contrary to popular opinion, the State does not reimburse us for any exemptions that may be granted and we expect all parents to pay their way.

**IF YOU'RE ASSISTING SOMEONE ELSE'S CHILD** - Any person who is not the biological parent or guardian of any child that they wish to admit to the school – shall, save in so far as they are legally exempt, be required to accept responsibility of Parent as defined in Section 1 of the Schools Act.

**3**

**SPONSOR** – If you have indicated that you are a Sponsor for this child, be aware that this means you are sponsoring their school fees and related costs (e.g. uniforms, stationery, tours etc.), and not simply “assisting them to fill out the forms”.

**4**

**IF YOU'RE DIVORCED** – The Supreme Court of Appeal has ruled that both Parents are jointly and severally liable to the school for fees, regardless of which Parent admitted the Child, who has custody, who has residence and who the divorce order says is responsible for the school fees. # First Day

## DAY ONE

**PARENTS** please drop your child at the main school gate on Tramore Road before 09h00 on Tuesday 13 January 2026. Feel free to take those special “first day” photos at the gate but please do not come into the school with your child.

**LEARNERS** on Day 1, you will be dressed in your new uniform, carrying only an exam pad and a pen and will be met at the main gate by our Matric Councillors and escorted to the hall or quad (depending on the weather) where you will be issued with your Induction Handbook. We will finish at 13h00 on Day 1.

## DAY TWO, THREE AND FOUR

From day 2 onwards you will use the Learners’ entrance (a little further down the street.)

# Orientation Week Program
